2025 IMPACT REPORT



The Resource Center's mission is clear: **No child should be without basic necessities.**

We exist to serve as a lifeline for vulnerable families experiencing the detrimental economic and emotional impacts of hunger and scarcity. We meet their immediate needs so they can work towards building a pathway of sustainability for their future.

Since its inception in 2021, The Resource Center has emerged as one of the largest emergency food and essentials providers in Fairfax County, serving more individuals annually.

Offering inclusive support to any zip code in Northern Virginia, our strategy focuses on supporting the dedicated frontline workers—social workers, police officers, hospice workers, school counselors, and nonprofit professionals—who work tirelessly with vulnerable families. By providing short-term resources, we empower these professionals to connect families to sustainable assistance, alleviating the burden they carry in our community.

In Fiscal Year 2025, The Resource Center served 10,333 individuals across Northern Virginia, helping to alleviate hunger, scarcity and overwhelming burdens.

A SNAPSHOT OF FAMILIES SERVED

“A family that is new to the country. Father is working delivering food, but finances are very tight. The mom is pregnant and expecting a baby shortly and a teenager and young adult in the family are looking for work. They are seeking assistance in the gap period until employment is secured.”

“A single dad whose wife was killed in a hit and run and is now caring for his 5-year-old son alone. He has limited access to resources and needs food during their hotel stay while we work on long-term housing solutions.”

“Four children in the household who currently receive breakfast and lunch assistance at school. However, due to the lunch schedule, all students are required to pack a daily snack and the family is unable to pack snacks due to significant financial hardships they are facing. Would you be able to provide consistent snacks for these children?”

“A family led by a courageous teen single mother of two who is in the process of transitioning to independent living after being separated from her family. She has worked diligently to support herself and be reunited with her children and is actively working toward building a stable future for herself and her children. Despite the challenges and trauma she has faced, this young mother remains deeply committed

to breaking the cycle of violence and substance abuse. She is in need of some basic essentials to augment her income while she gains stability.”

“A family in urgent need. Mother recently suffered a stroke, was hospitalized for three weeks, and father who is the primary provider lost his job while caring for his grandparents. They have four children and are struggling with food insecurity.”

“A single mom who receives no child support. She works two full-time jobs but was in a car accident last week and now has limited mobility and unable to work currently. She is not using SNAP but has used a food pantry at her church in the past. At this time the pantry does not have the items she is most in need of. Can you help?”
